I am not often astounded, but lately I have been just that, to discover that a number of our newer owners and renters are unaware that KVTA is a covenant controlled community. Those of us who have lived here for several years, along with those who read all the documents when buying a home here should be aware. For anyone who does not understand 'covenant controlled,' I would refer you to our website where our covenants (community regulations), by-laws, and policies are spelled out in some detail. I would also ask anyone who does not have access to a computer to contact me and I shall personally get a written copy to you. It is important for any community to have a set of rules, or guidelines, for living in a neighborhood, as it makes for a better community and also greatly assists in maintaining property values both of which ought to be important in this day and age. Due to our covenants, we require notification whenever a resident plans to change anything on the exterior of their property. Your request should be submitted in writing to the Board or our Architectural Committee for approval, **prior** to beginning a project, or doing some new landscaping. Within your patio area, where not seen from outside driveways or sidewalks, you are at liberty to do as you choose.

Another reminder for us all is that garbage is to be bagged, as an accommodation for "Waste Management." This also can be a security issue for your private paperwork, so that it will not be blown about for anyone to see, and then have to be picked up by your neighbors or our grounds folks. "Blade Runners" has asked that hoses be kept off the grass, when not in use, to prevent them being run over by their mowers. Would like to think that dog owners might wish to consider how they personally would feel about a mower they owned being exposed to a dog's waste.

On a brighter note, the grounds look fabulous and several new residents, who I have been fortunate to meet at our coffees, or while walking my dog, have praised our property and even gone so far as to state that they decided on KVTA because of the look of our community. It makes home ownership here even nicer and certainly ought to encourage us to take pride in our lovely neighborhood.
