Allowing a dog to run free after dark has become a nuisance and the Board of Directors intends to address such situations early next year.

You are going to see Warren, Victor, and Alex busy in the coming months, either working on the gardens in front of some buildings or trimming bushes and pine trees as the weather permits. We still expect precipitation in the form of snow one of these days, at which time they will all turn their attention to plowing streets and driveways and clearing sidewalks.
