Message from the President

September 2013

In this month's newsletter, I will attempt to address several issues of concern for a few folks who have been writing or calling about things happening, or not happening, here in The Village.

First, allow me to clarify, your Board is well aware that many of our driveways are yet to be fully restored but they shall be back on our radar in 2015 and then until 'all' have been fully made new again. The reason for suspending this work had to do with the substantial renovation expense required on two 'streets,' NOT the property of the City of Centennial, as some believe, but actually belong to your HOA– namely, Columbine Way and East Geddes Place, west of Knolls Way. Columbine was done this year and East Geddes Place will be completed in 2014. The expense to fully replace these two major roadways consumes an entire annual 'road budget,' however, when completed we anticipate a life expectancy of 20 years per road. Beginning then in 2015, we will be in a position to fully replace all our other driveways at 3 (or more) each year until the entire complex has been fully updated. The roads and driveways in the community will be better able to handle double-axle trucks which now make deliveries along with our garbage and recycling vehicles. Originally, roadways within in our community were designed with a 6 inch base, but heavier vehicles today require an 8 inch base (more expensive). We did patch work on a several driveways, leading up to our need to replace these two main arteries, in order to stabilize them during this time period.

Concerns about automobiles, boats, trailers, and motorhomes need to be directed to the City of Centennial, unless they affect our two 'roads' or temporary parking. While all homes provided garage space for two automobiles back in the late seventies, some trucks and vans now will simply not fit. Today, a family may have more than two autos with either teens or elder parents now sharing their home. Our covenants ask for consideration, but do not obligate a resident to use their garage to park or otherwise store vehicles. We encourage residents to talk with one another and to be considerate, but the Board is not in a position to mediate individual situations beyond our authority.

On lighting and security, guess I need to clarify the association does not plan to provide lighting on a garage. My last newsletter was intended to offer lighting within community areas not sufficiently lighted during night-time hours. A few requests have been made for lights where we presently have a lighted post, a parking light stand, or even where there is a city street light. We will evaluate the light cast from these sources but are primarily looking to locations of obscure darkness which might have potential security concerns. We certainly do encourage homeowners to consider lights on their garages – more lighting always helps.

As to inappropriate behavior by occupants of automobiles using our parking places at odd hours of the mornings, afternoons, or evenings, it has been suggested that a photo of a suspicious license plate could prove useful if you have one of the newer cell phone. Arapahoe High School has been made aware of our belief that some instances of this 'parking' is a result of their student population and they do wish to cooperate in any way possible including expanding security sweeps beyond the two shopping centers. The Board will be looking into private property and surveillance signage.

Easy Apple Foldovers with Apple Glaze

Filling 1/2 cup chopped walnuts

- 1/4 cup packed brown sugar2 tablespoons butter or margarine
- 2 medium apples, peeled, finely chopped
- 1 tablespoon all-purpose flour

1/4 teaspoon ground cinnamon

(If you're not a fan of walnuts, substitute a handful of raisins or dried cranberries.)

Crust: 1 box Pillsbury® refrigerated pie crusts, softened as directed on box

Glaze 2/3 cup powdered sugar 1/8 teaspoon ground cinnamon 2 to 3 teaspoons apple cider or apple juice

• 1 Heat oven to 375°F. In small bowl, mix walnuts, brown sugar and butter with pastry blender or fork until crumbly. In medium bowl, stir together apples, flour and 1/4 teaspoon cinnamon; set aside.

• 2 Unroll crusts on work surface. Cut each crust into quarters. Place about 1/4 cup apple mixture on one half of each pie crust wedge. Sprinkle with walnut mixture. Fold untopped half over filled half (foldovers will be full). Press edges with fork to seal. Prick top with fork. Place on ungreased large cookie sheet.

• 3 Bake 22 to 28 minutes or until golden brown. Cool 10 minutes. Meanwhile, in small bowl, stir together glaze ingredients until smooth. Drizzle over foldovers. Cool completely, about 30 minutes.
