Message from the President

December 2013

It seems early to be wishing everyone a Merry Christmas and a Happy New Year already, but with our experiencing 'winter' this past week, it is indeed appropriate. Thanks to everyone who has decorated with their Xmas lights as, along with the snow, the community has a much more festive look. It sure makes walking after dark and in the cold more pleasant. The Board extends wishes for a safe and happy holiday to anyone who will be travelling and to those who will be staying in town as well.

With this last snow fall, and our plowing and shoveling, we have learned that it is important to have 'stored vehicles?' relocated from our temporary overflow parking at some point each day. When we are unable to properly clear snow and ice buildup from these areas, we reduce parking spots for visitors or guests for weeks at a time. Please be considerate! We certainly don't wish to inconvenience anyone by having a vehicle towed at the owner's expense. We also suggest extra caution when walking.

We are experiencing an increase in security by the local police and Arapahoe H.S. security due to Board requests and some residents calling when they see any suspicious activity. The police have informed us that anyone who calls reporting such situations does NOT need to give EITHER a name or address for fear of reprisal. We are not suggesting over-loading calls for help, since this can send a wrong message but, it is prudent to be aware, cautious and proactive. The KVTA homeowner's association is unable to interfere in situations which would otherwise need to be directed to law enforcement for Centennial.

OK ... so how to address dog droppings? Past newsletters have seen me request and yes, even plead, to dog owners for their being responsible to pick up after 'fido' ... especially at this time of year, when the neighborhood can look even worse for a lack of caring. I carry extra bags with me and speak to dog walkers, if seeing someone ignoring a mess, and without being confrontational, simply explain the importance for the health, safety and welfare of our entire community. Picking up after a pet is a covenant violation and we are a Covenant Controlled Community. I encourage anyone walking in the neighborhood to carry a bag to give to a dog owner 'in need'. You may carry a bag even if you do not have a dog.

Speaking of 'Covenants', the ACC folks and your Board, have approved a new updated set of regulations and would ask all residents (owners as well as tenants) to review, understand and to fully comply. Print copies will be distributed to every home and non-resident owner after the first of the year. The latest updates will be on our website by January.

As 2013 comes to a close, may I personally thank the entire community for the spirit of co-operation shown to the Board this past year. It is a privilege to serve you all and a pleasure to keep our neighborhood as 'special' as it has always been for me. May God bless everyone at this time of year......Dick

Crock Pot Baked Apples

4 large granny smith apples or 4 large cooking apples 1/3 cup firmly packed brown sugar 1/4 cup dried cranberries or 1/4 cup raisins or 1/4 cup dried cherries or 1/4 cup mixed dried fruit 1/2 cup dry white wine or 1/2 cup apple juice 2 tablespoons unsalted butter, melted 1/2 teaspoon ground cinnamon 1/4 teaspoon ground nutmeg 1/2 cup chopped nuts



- Core apples, combine brown sugar and dried fruit (cranberries, raisins, cherries or mixed fruits) and fill the center of the apples with the sugar/fruit mixture; place the apples in a 5- to 6-quart crock pot.
- Combine the wine or apple juice with the melted butter and pour it over the apples; sprinkle the apples with cinnamon and nutmeg; cover the crock pot and cook on low for 2 to 3 hours or until the apples are tender.
- To serve, spoon the apples into individual dessert dishes, spoon the wine/apple juices over the ٠ apples, sprinkle with chopped nuts
