Chris, a two-year cancer survivor, was diagnosed with stage 2 colon cancer in the fall of 2013 at the age of 81 following a routine colonoscopy. There is no history of cancer in his family, and it was quite a shock, to put it mildly. He wrote his book because he wished to offer courage and hope to other cancer patients, and indeed, to anyone facing a major challenge.

Everything changed for Chris when he began to see cancer not as an enemy, but as a teacher. He describes how he found joy and peace as he learned to face his fears, especially the fear of death. His big takeaway: Don't forget your colonoscopy, folks, it can save your life!
