FROM JOE JOHNSTON TREASURER OF THE HOMEOWNERS' ASSOCIATION

While serving as Treasurer for the past 6 years, I have had the opportunity to meet many residents and enjoy sharing where/how the Board allocates monies for day-to-day operations (Operating Fund) and replacements of infrastructure from our Reserve Fund. Our largest variable expense is water. Last year we spent \$119,000 or 23% of the Operating Fund for water. Warren carefully monitors spikes in residential water use and the irrigation meters. During the summer months, Denver Water increases our residential rate by a factor of 2 and our irrigation rate by a factor of 2.5 times the standard rate.

You may have noticed we have more employees as well. Warren and his team are able to reduce additional overhead costs associated by using contractors plus we believe he and his team do the work more efficiently and with higher quality results.

From a Reserve Fund perspective, the HOA has re-invested over \$500,000 in the past 3 years to replace both of the roads the Association owns, replaced close to 50 of the 250 sprinkler zones, fixed sidewalks, repaired driveways and completed numerous landscaping projects. We have moved from doing mostly patch work to doing complete replacements where needed noting that Knolls Village was built in 1978. We recently completed a new Reserve Study which shows us funded at 91%.

With the increases in the cost of materials, water, garbage, lawn care, etc., we are needing to allocate more of our total budget to the Operating Fund and cut back on Reserve replacements. The Board begins its annual process in June for establishing next year's budget, forecasting not for just 2017 but rather a 5 year view in order to maintain our Reserve balance without having to consistently ask for a dues increase every year or two.

I hope this helps create some more awareness as to where we stand from a fiscal perspective for the KVTA.

Garage Side Lights: Sidelights are important for our safety as well as the look of our community. Please take a look at your fixtures to be sure they are in good condition and in working order. If you have the original fixture and it is in good condition but needs a globe, please leave a message at (303) 796-0540 and one will be provided. If you have a rusted fixture or one that is missing the lightbulb, globe, or is not in good working condition, please replace them.

Rabbit Holes Under Front Porches: It seems this year we have a bumper crop of baby bunnies, and although they are cute, the holes they make under front porches can cause serious damage. Over the years, the dirt under many of our porches has settled weakening porch support. These rabbit burrows can create additional stress causing your porch to crack. In some cases, we have seen porches collapse or even pull away and cause additional damage to the townhouse itself.
