RECYCLING TIPS

There are reasons why we need to recycle correctly. If we don't follow the guidelines our recyclables will end up in the landfill instead of being recycled. Each month a recycling tip will be explained in our news letter. The first tip is about cleanliness:

Keep it Clean! Protect Health and Recycling Value by Cleaning Your items

Did you know food is the #1 contaminant in recycling centers? Your recyclables are sorted by real people whose health and safety are put at risk by food resi due on recyclables because of mold and pests like ro

dents and stinging insects. Food and liquids inside containers can also destroy the value of recycled pa per and affect the value of containers.

So, how clean is clean enough? Before recycling, be sure to empty your containers by scraping out all food, or pouring liquids out. Give each container a quick shot of water, shake it up to loosen any food remain ing, pour it out, and then recycle it. If you're unable to get it clean enough, go ahead and throw it in the trash to be safe.

Architectural Control Committee Covenant Corner – A few things for your consideration this month.... Did you know??

Garage & Patio Lights: We have had some complaints about patio lights and garage sidelights being too bright and interfering with the neighbors. Hanging lights that are visible to neighbors have also been an issue. We have worked with the Board on the following guideline for clar ification.

• Back Patio Porch and Garage bulbs should be white or frosted rather than clear so they do not put off glare for your neighbors. LED bulbs should have a "K value" of 3000 or less, which is generally called "soft white.

 If you have hanging patio lights, they should not be visible to neighbors, meaning, they should be at or below, garage roof or fence level or otherwise ob structed from view. Hanging lights should not be so bright as to be bothersome to neighbors.
