RECYCLING TIPS

The recycling tip for December concerns holiday wrapping paper and holiday cards.

You can recycle most greeting cards and their envelopes if they are made solely of paper. However, do not recycle cards that contain glitter, flocking, foil, bows, metallic accents, or photo paper.

Wrapping paper that is solely made of paper is recyclable. You can test it by scrunching it. If it stays in a ball, it's likely all paper and can be recycled. If it is foil or has any glitter, flocking, metallic accents, or glossy coating it is not recyclable. Ribbons, bows, and non-paper decorations are not recyclable.

One reusable alternative to wrapping paper is to use fabric in holiday prints to cover your presents.

This is the fifth in a monthly series of Recycling Tips. The recycling tips are provided by Karen Hannon, longtime resident of KVTA and a member of the Littleton Zero Waste Gang. She checks the information with KVTA's waste management vendor to ensure accuracy and relevance to KVTA residents. Then, the KVTA Board has been given the opportunity to review the tips prior to their publication.
