November 2024 Update: The City received a Development Pre-Submittal Application for a proposed residential development located at the southern end of The Streets at SouthGlenn, located on the former Sears site.

What Northwood Ravin is Proposing

Northwood Ravin is currently proposing 2 multi-family apartment complexes and a public park, spanning approximately 11 acres within the South Redevelopment Area of the Streets at SouthGlenn. The vacant Sears building and the office building at the corner of E. Easter Ave. and S. Race St. are to be demolished to make way for the new development.

Park

The park must be a minimum of 25,000 square feet and must be completed prior to final occupancy of the first apartment complex.

Residential Dwelling Units

Currently, one 4-story complex and one 5-story complex is being proposed. One complex will include approximately 132 rental units, while the other will have approximately 266 rental units. The complexes offer a mix of floor plans to meet the needs of multiple household types. 1,125 dwelling units are permitted within the Street at SouthGlenn; presently there are 214 at The Portola. A total of 513 additional dwelling units would be permitted within the Street at SouthGlenn if the proposed 398 units are built.
